Bharathi Theertha honors MWRD Commissioner Mariyana Spyropoulos

Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD) Commissioner Mariyana Spyropoulos received two honors from Bharathi Theertha, a non-profit organization that works to improve the quality of life in impoverished areas of India and the United States.

For exemplary service rendered to the field of water and sanitation, Commissioner Spyropoulos received the Jala Seva Bharathi award which was presented by Bharathi Theertha President Dr. Prakasam Tata.

Commissioner Spyropoulos and former Commissioner Frank Avila were both honored for their work the past two years in chairing the Water and Waste Conference held virtually in the U.S. and India. The three-day events supported dual time zones and featured 3-D virtual booths, eight educational tracts and 200+ subject matter experts representing more than 20 countries.

Hyderabad, India, with a population in the metropolitan area of just under 10 million, is laying the groundwork for constructing wastewater treatment infrastructure as
