Goats and sheep are baaack!

Following a successful pilot scale operation in 2019, the MWRD again recruited a hard-working herd to graze on vegetation on the grounds of an MWRD facility and maintain landscaping in an environmentally responsible way.

This summer the MWRD enlisted the services of 65 goats and sheep from Vegetation Solutions in Wisconsin to help trim-or eat up-overgrowth and invasive species and maintain the MWRD's native prairie landscaping (NPL) at the MWRD's Calumet Water Reclamation Plant (WRP) on the Far South Side. No Wipes Down the Pipes!

The COVID-19 pandemic has increased the demand for household cleaning items, including disinfecting wipes, paper towels and toilet paper which have sometimes been hard to find. As a result, some have turned to alternatives such as "flushable" wipes and other paper products.

In this educational video, MWRD President Kari K. Steele demonstrates how various products do not break down or dissolve sufficiently in water, and as a result, those materials can clog pipes and cause sewer backups in homes and neighborhoods. Remember, only flush pee, poop and toilet paper!





MWRD Board of Commissioners to meet Thurs., October 1




