MWRD Executive Director resigns

Effective June 27, 2018, David St. Pierre has resigned as Executive Director of the Metropolitan Water Reclamation District of Greater Chicago (MWRD).

Mr. St. Pierre joined MWRD on June 20, 2011 and served diligently for seven years, overseeing a staff of approximately 2,000 employees, an annual budget of \$1.2 billion dollars, and wastewater infrastructure that serves the equivalent of 10 million residents. Together, we have made great strides in our mission to provide wastewater treatment and stormwater protection to the people of Cook County, and we are proud of the work we have accomplished during Mr. St. Pierre's tenure.
